PUBLIC COMMENT

Frank Colla, West Pittston provided comment regarding parking at the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport. He stated that the parking regulations and parking fees are unfair.

Mary Connors provided comment on her mother's death because of her Power of Attorney rights being ignored. Ms. Connors asked for accountability from any and all public officials and asked for a Grand Jury Investigation. After explanation and discussion, Ms. Connors was instructed that this matter is for the courts to decide.

Susan Bartholomew-Palmer, Wilkes-Barre, provided comment and questioned legal issues regarding guardianship of her brother. She also believes that people under the Agency's guardianship have their assets removed needlessly. After explanation and discussion, Ms. Bartholomew-Palmer was instructed that she would need to go to the Court System and the Legislators to change these policies.

Mayor Goldsworthy, as a business man and a resident of Luzerne County, commended and thanked the Commissions for fighting for AAA Baseball in Northeastern Pennsylvania.

Murray Ufberg, echoed the Mayors comments and commended the Commissioners for taking beneficial steps for Luzerne County regarding AAA Baseball.

Baseball Option Agreement

Request a motion to disapprove the OPTION AGREEMENT between SWB Yankees LLC, a Delaware Corporation, and Multi-Purpose Stadium Authority of Lackawanna County approved by the Authority on April 5, 2007 and by the Lackawanna County Board of Commissioners on April 10, 2007.

Commissioner Urban commented that the agreement with Lackawanna County and Mandalay is inconsistent with the 1989 agreement and expressed his displeasure with this agreement.

Commissioner Skrepenak stated that, pertaining to all 3 motions regarding Baseball that we are thrilled that the Yankees are here. However, there has been no consideration given to Luzerne County for participation in planning activities around this franchise. A letter was sent to the New York Yankees, with no reply. Our #1 goal, with or without the sale of the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Yankees is to keep AAA Baseball in the area and that in the event of a sale of that franchise; Luzerne County receive it's full and complete portion of proceeds.

Commissioner Vonderheid summarized the issues by stating that the agreement Lackawanna County approved allows baseball to leave Northeastern Pennsylvania, taking \$5 million away from Luzerne County. We will have to buy the franchise back along with the property. Robert Cordaro's intent is to take politics out of baseball; however without government participation baseball wouldn't be here. Luzerne County politics have never played a role in baseball.


