

Global Election Protocols and Fraud Resistant Recommendations for Elections

April 28, 2008, Source: The Associated Press: "The Supreme Court rules that states can require voters to produce photo identification without violating their constitutional rights", validating justly inspired voter ID laws.

October 13, 2019, "What the rest of the world calls anti-fraud measures, the radical progressives in America call racist". 46 of 47 European countries require photo ID, with the one exception being the UK. Fortunately though, legislation has been proposed, and is being considered requiring voter ID.

An overview of European countries voting protocols show that, with the exception of citizens living abroad, 74% ban absentee voting entirely. 6% of countries allow it, but with safeguarded policies in place, requiring evidence of military or medical exceptions. 15% allow absentee voting, the condition being a photo ID to acquire your ballot.

Countries that did make changes for the pandemic made them to be provisional, sunseting after one year. They noted that this was a one-time measure for Covid19. These countries learned the hard way, and were not about to allow election fraud to upend the integrity of their electoral process again.

Examples of protocols from international countries are as follows: Norway, Northern Ireland, Germany, France, Israel, Mexico and Iceland require photo ID. In addition to this, Poland requires a certificate for an absentee ballot from a doctor due to a medical disability. Japan provides each voter with a ticket bearing a unique bar code matching up with that person's identification. The United Kingdom is now proposing legislation requiring voter ID.

A 2005 bipartisan report commissioned by the American University Center for Democracy and Election Management, also known as the Carter-Baker report gave eighty-seven recommendations for improving the electoral process. Quoted from the report, and drawing the most attention is, "absentee ballots remain the largest source of potential voter fraud." This was not a flippant remark; this remark was based on research and analysis. Additionally, the following recommendations were made:

- Add a paper trail to electronic voting machines
 - Require voter ID
 - Halt ballot harvesting
 - Maintain accurate voter rolls
 - Allow for election monitoring by observers
 - Refrain media from calling the election prematurely

A contemporary report on election integrity authored by David Ball, signifies the same areas for improvement. These include:

- Overhaul of the SURE data base system of voter rolls
 - Ban involvement of third-party involvement in elections
 - Require voter ID
 - Eliminate drop boxes
 - Return to one day voting
 - Adhere to absentee voting rules- prior to act 77
 - Repeal act 77
