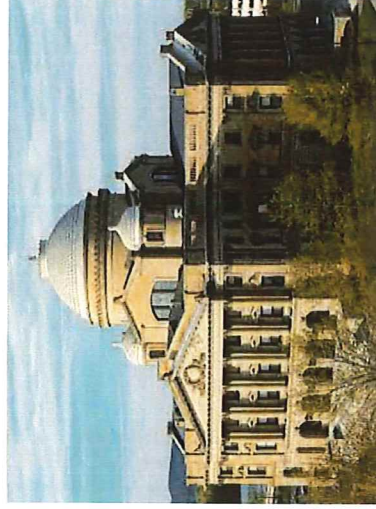

Additionally, the club was used as a means of support for sick and injured miners in their time of need. Today, the Henry Citizens Club and Ladies Auxiliary support several community charities, including provide financial donations through its Flower and Sick committees and coats to children at Solomon Elementary School. The Henry Citizen Club has developed a strong reputation for the highest quality of service throughout its history. By steady adherence to the principles of fairness, reliability and integrity, it has become a leader in the community and a modal that is worthy of emulation.
