Honorable Members of the Luzerne County Board of Elections:

The purpose of a Democratic Republic like ours is the preservation and protection of Freedom, of the rights of individuals made in the Image of God.

Power is conferred on those in government by the People through the ballot box.

Elections must be open, fair and honest. They must not infringe on the right and the duty of responsible, registered citizens to vote. They must take care to exclude invalid voters. People must have confidence in them. I have voted in Luzerne County since 1981.

I have never seen such irregularities in Luzerne County.

The top of my ballot was marked "Democratic." I was voting as a Republican in the May 18th Primary.

This many days out from the Primary I am still not sure what the final tallies were.

In the past, before the 2020 General Election, the results were known by the next day.

Voters were disenfranchised because they left the polls because they refused to vote with the wrong party at the top of their ballot. They were not called back.

There was a big delay in counting write-ins.

The public has lost its confidence in the election process in Luzerne County.

We have already lost confidence in the election process in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania due to the "irregularities" in the 2020 election and Act 77.

The Precautionary Principle must be applied here.

This loss of confidence correlates with Dominion providing the voting machines in Luzerne County and in a large part of the State.

They have failed us.

They must be removed and replaced with something else, such as paper ballots, for the November General Election. They must not be replaced with any machines that are "proprietary" or which can be hacked. Voting machines/ ballots must be totally and completely isolated from the outside world while they are being used to vote, and they must be easily audited. They must be "user friendly" to the voter. They must be protected from vote manipulation during and after an election.

There must be a complete audit of this primary election, including hand counts, not computer counts. Dominion must bear the cost of this audit.

If any fraud or dishonesty is discovered, it must be prosecuted to the fullest extent. If false or misleading claims were made by Dominion, they must pay civil damages to the County and its citizens.

Regardless, Dominion must be told to take back its machines and to refund the money paid for them to Luzerne County.

No monies should be paid to Dominion for "services" they did during 2021 or 2020.

We had no problem with voting before these machines were installed.

Get rid of them.

We also had no problems with voting when Ms. Crispell ran the Luzerne County Election Bureau. Please also look into the Election Bureau to see what happened after she left. I am aware of two people who were disenfranchised by the mail-in voting process in the November, 2020 General Election.

Also please do what you can to repair the damage done to voting in Luzerne County by Pa Act 77.
