HUD'S CONSOLIDATED PLANNING PROCESS

- U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development
- Application for funding for the CDBG, HOME and ESG Programs.
- The lead agency responsible for the development of the County's consolidated plan is the Community Development Office.

HUD'S CONSOLIDATED PLANNING **PROCESS**

- Coordinated vision for community development actions for the upcoming five years.
- The county uses the community development needs assessment, to develop strategies for addressing those needs, and to undertake specific actions consistent with those strategies.

2023 ACTION PLAN & PROJECTS

- The 2023 Action Plan for Luzerne County is the fourth year in which the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan strategy will be implemented.
- The Plan identifies housing and community development needs.
- The strategy was developed based upon needs of the low/moderate income residents and those with special needs.

- Newport Township – Streetscape Project, Glen Lyon
- West Pittston Borough – Street/Sewer Improvement Project
- Freeland Borough – Street Improvement Project
- Wyoming Borough – ADA Project
- Assisted 15 families purchase new homes.
- Weinberg Food Bank – 450 meals; 195 program sites; and 38,000 people.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT **SUCCESS**

- Since 2005 over 400 families have purchased new homes.
- Since 2013 approx. \$1,000,000 has helped eradicate 50 blighted properties in our boroughs/townships.
- Over the last 5 years we have committed approx. \$5 million to help reconstruct county owned roads/bridges.
